ON BROADWAY

JACK LONDON Experience Oakland's famed waterfront with panoramic bay views, dining, libations, bowling, bocce and live jazz. Take a ferry ride, stroll the scenic boardwalk, rent a bike or kayak, catch a movie or relax on the lawn. OLD OAKLAND Step into the historic heart of Oakland with dozens of restaurants, outdoor cafes, pubs and art galleries that keep the vibe lively day and night. In the 1870's, Old Oakland was the western terminus of the

CHINATOWN Experience Asian culture by exploring the architecture, restaurants, specialty shops, markets and bakeries in the nation's 4th largest Chinatown district. CENTRAL DOWNTOWN Home to historic City Hall and Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland's Central Downtown serves 80,000 daily workers, residents and visitors. Explore City Center, an inviting pedestrian plaza with a mix of shops and restaurants, and free year-round noontime concerts and events.

LAKE MERRITT OFFICE DISTRICT

The "Jewel of Oakland," Lake Merritt is a community gathering place drawing residents and visitors to its

peaceful, shimmering shores for strolling, jogging, bird-watching and recreation. Visit North America's oldest wildlife refuge (est. 1870), Children's Fairyland and the Lake Merritt Boating Center. Bonsai, Japanese, Pollinator and several other gardens also await you.

VALDEZ TRIANGLE Likened to South of Market 20 years ago because of its DIY personality and potential for exciting growth and change, this district houses a mix of buildings from the 1880s to 2000s. KONO (KOREATOWN-NORTHGATE)

Visit the pulse of Oakland's art scene. Oakland First Fridays/Art Murmur, occurring every First Friday 5-9 pm on Telegraph between Grand and 27th, includes art and maker galleries,
